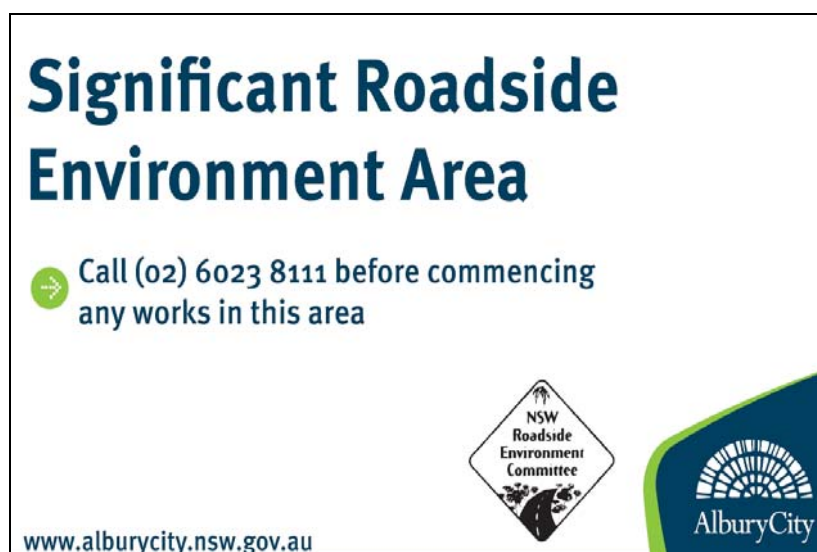


## SIGNIFICANT ROADSIDE ENVIRONMENT AREA SIGNS



Significant Roadside Environment Area signs (example above) have been erected to highlight roadside areas that have significant conservation values. This may include native vegetation, wildlife habitat, geological importance, Aboriginal sites and historical landmarks.

The signs are to alert you to take special care when in the area and that permission is required to undertake any clearing, maintenance work or road construction activities.

When in a Significant Roadside Environment Area, please pay particular attention to your impact on the roadside and scrutinise others in the area.

### To protect these areas

- Assist your local council to monitor the area to ensure that its health is maintained.
- Report any damaging or potentially damaging activities such as illegal clearing, firewood collection, rubbish dumping to your local council.
- Ask your local council if there are any ways you can be involved in helping improve the area, such as through Bushcare and Landcare activities or an Adopt-a-Road group.
