STATE GOVERNMENT FUNDING FOR FLOOD DAMAGED ROADS **IN MOREE SHIRE**

Minister for Roads Michael Daley today announced the NSW Government was providing more than \$2 million in funding for Moree Shire roads damaged by floods earlier this year.

Mr Daley said the Rees Government would provide a total of \$2.16 million to help restore and repair roads in the area.

“The floods in February this year made life extremely difficult for local residents and businesses, and damage to local and regional roads made the recovery process even harder,” he said.

“To make sure residents and businesses can rebuild their lives as quickly as possible, more than \$1.5 million of the total amount of NSW Government funding will be allocated to local roads, which bore the brunt of the flood damage.

“We’re committed to helping the people who live and work in Moree shire, by ensuring roads damaged by floods are restored, so life in regional areas can get back to normal as quickly as possible.

“This is another example of the State Government’s commitment to improving and delivering better roads in every region of NSW,” said Mr Daley.

The funding was allocated to various categories of roads in Moree Plains Shire following an RTA assessment of the damaged roads:

- State Roads \$608,829
- Regional Roads \$44,663
- Local Roads \$1,503,926
