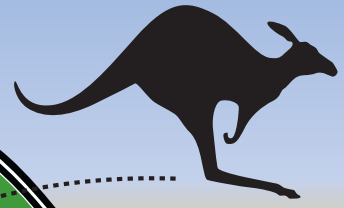

Driving in the Western Region

When you drive in the country, sooner or later you'll come across an animal on the road. In fact, more than half the collisions RTA staff have in Western Region involve straying stock, kangaroos or other wildlife.

it's bound to happen

Reduce your risk:

- AVOID travel at the high-risk times, DAWN and DUSK.
- SLOW DOWN if you're travelling in a high-risk area or time.
- Use special caution in those areas marked with animal warning signs.

If you come across an animal on the road:

- DON'T SWERVE - it's better to hit the animal than to swerve and lose control of the vehicle.
- SLOW DOWN - steering around the animal in a controlled manner if you can.
- STOP - if you can do so safely. You never know what the animal will do next.
