HOW TO PREPARE A PEDESTRIAN ACCESS AND MOBILITY PLAN – AN EASY THREE STAGE GUIDE

GENERAL

Enclosed are two copies of *How to Prepare a Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan – An easy three stage guide (Version 1.0)*.

This manual provides a framework for use by transport planners and traffic engineers in the development of a Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan (PAMP). PAMPs ensure better planning for pedestrians. They are designed to identify the pedestrian facilities that are required to more effectively integrate walking with land use and other transport systems.

The manual outlines major issues to be considered in the development of a PAMP and highlights useful resources and techniques that can simplify the task of planning for pedestrians. The manual is divided into three stages and takes a step-by-step approach to the development of the plan.

The three stages in the development of a PAMP outlined in the manual are:

1. Objectives – what can be achieved within a reasonable time in planning for pedestrians
2. Preparation – the nuts and bolts of preparing a PAMP
3. Implementation – making sure that planned activities and works can be implemented

The RTA trusts that this manual will be of assistance to its staff, Councils and interested members of the community in helping to better integrate pedestrian facilities into their local area.
